# TAKING RIVAROXABAN

(Also known as Xarelto®)



Your doctor prescribed rivaroxaban to keep blood clots from forming



Rivaroxaban along with other medicines will help prevent stroke



Rivaroxaban is an oral anticoagulant and it is often called a "blood thinner"



Rivaroxaban must be taken once a day with heavy meal to work properly



A blood test to check your kidneys will be done prior reason to take this to starting rivaroxaban and at least every year



A common medicine is atrial fibrillation



Atrial fibrillation is an irregular heart rhythm that can cause blood clots to form which can lead to stroke

Most people who have been prescribed rivaroxaban to prevent Stroke take it for the rest of their lives

### **TELL YOUR DOCTOR IF YOU HAVE:**



Bleeding **aums** 



Bruising too much



Nose bleeds

## **CALL YOUR DOCTOR OR GO TO AN EMERGENCY ROOM IF YOU DEVELOP:**



Difficulty breathing or wheezing



Stomach pain/ vomiting blood



Black or bloody stools



Severe headache with nausea

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO:



Take your rivaroxaban at the same time every day

- Do not stop taking your rivaroxaban without talking to your doctor
- Missing a dose can put you at risk for forming clots



#### If you miss a dose:

- · If it is within 12 hours of usually taking it, take the missed dose
- If it is more than 12 hours, skip the dose
- Do not take two doses at the same time
- Never take an extra dose to catch up



Make an appointment with your doctor before your prescription runs out

- Tell your doctor or dentist that you are on rivaroxaban if you need any surgery or procedure

Obtain a medical alert bracelet to indicate you are on rivaroxaban - in case of emergency, it would be important for your health care team to know



Tell your pharmacist or doctor about all the medicines that you may be taking, including vitamins, herbal products or recreational drugs



Report any side effects to your doctor or pharmacist so that they can give you tips on how to minimize them
